ST MARY'S SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT

## The purpose of this Code of Conduct is to ensure all pupils are ready to learn, respectful and safe.

0	Consideration, courtesy and respect should be shown at all times.
0	Everyone should always try to understand other people's point of view
0	Children are expected to make it as easy as possible for everyone to learn and for the teacher to teach, whether this takes place inside or outside the classroom.
0	Children should always show friendship, kindness and care to others.
0	Children should walk sensibly, quietly and on the left when walking around the school.
0	Children should always speak politely to each other and all adults.
0	The school should be kept clean and tidy so that it can be a welcoming place of which we can be proud.
0	Children should take pride in their appearance and possessions and have respect for other people.
0	Children should remember that the school's reputation depends on the way they behave
0	Children should make every effort to attend every day and be punctual.
0	Staff to acknowledge when other staff members or visitors enter into the classroom and to greet them.
0	Children to be prompted to do so as well.
These rules are designed for the safety of all children:	
0	There must be no running in the school building
0	Before school, at playtime and lunchtime, children are not allowed in classrooms unless with an adult or instructed by an adult.
0	Climbing on furniture, gates and fences is not allowed.
0	Children must not play on the terrace or muga unless given specific permission to do so.

O Hands and feet are kept to ourselves and extra care is taken on the stairs.

## At the start of each session all children will:

- O From Year 1 upwards-remove coats whilst lining up.
- O Enter the class only when directed to by an adult.
- O Walk in to the classroom with voices away.
- O Enter the cloakroom following guidance of numbers of children -as directed by an adult and from Year 1 upwards, the 'pupil of the day' will monitor the number of children in the cloakroom.
- O Follow the class system about where to put reading books, homework, water bottles etc.
