




Dear parents and carers,

#### **School Council**

On Monday 29<sup>th</sup> January, School Council went on a trip to the Houses of Parliament. We organised this trip by writing a letter to Marsha De Cordova (our MP) and she allowed us to visit her work! When we got to the Houses of Parliament, we all had to go through security and Ms Hunt and Ms Lerena had their whistles taken off them! Then, we walked through to Westminster Hall where lots of famous royals (like the Queen) have laid in state. It is over a thousand years old! Donald Trump asked to speak in Westminster Hall, but he was not allowed to speak here. Also, when King Charles I was told he would be beheaded, this was in Westminster Hall too!

We met two kind ladies named Sharon and Grace who work for Marsha De Cordova and they showed us the House of Commons and the House of Lords. The seats in the House of Commons were green and the seats in the House of Lords were red and, in these chambers, they share opinions and debate. We also saw lots of statues of previous Prime Ministers such as Margaret Thatcher and Winston Churchill. There was also a blue room where King Charles got changed for an important ceremony in the House

of Lords: the mirror was very small! We learned that when MPs vote, they do it digitally and need their special pass to scan in. If they don't have it with them, they cannot vote and enter special areas in Parliament.

We will be asking children to dress up as a character from a book while taking part in fun World Book Day act ivies!





Rosie went into the sweet shop with 10p to spend.


