If the Pathway is right for you, it will give you options, opportunities, support and direction. Plus, the dream of playing for England!

On Sunday 23rd June we are hosting an England Para Talent Day at Fulham FC Training Ground, Motspur Park, KT3 6PT. The day will start at 10am.

FA England Para Talent Days are your opportunity to learn more about the Pathway and to be selected for a programme within it.

If successful, players will be invited to join a Para Talent Hub. At Fulham FC Foundation our Para Talent Hub sessions run monthly at Fulham FC Training Ground. Players have no obligation to stop any other football they do elsewhere - instead it is actively encouraged that where possible they take part in other disability football, mainstream and/or grassroots football in addition to the programme.
