

Sight tests for children are **FREE!**

Short-sightedness is increasing, globally and in the UK. It is now twice as common as in the 1950s and children are becoming shortsighted at an earlier age.

- Over 20% of parents have never taken their child for an eye test
- It is also more common in children whose parents are short-sighted.

Children from South Asian and African Caribbean families also have a higher risk of developing short-sightedness.

The increase in close work such as reading, computers, small screens and spending less time outside has likely driven the rise in short-sightedness (myopia).

The College of Optometrists therefore recommend that children, particularly those aged 5 to 12:

- Limit screen time
- Spend at least 2 hours every day outside
- Have regular sight tests
- When on the screen or reading hold the device or book at least 30cm from the face

The only way to prevent myopia from getting worse is with corrective lenses.
