








Maths	English	Science
<p>In maths this term, we will focus on multiplication and division by recognising equal groups and using repeated addition. We will also explore position and direction (left/right, forwards/backwards, above/below) and begin learning about simple fractions, including halves and quarters.</p> <p>At home, you can practise counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s. Look for equal groups in everyday situations. Use positional language in daily routines and share food to explore halves and quarters.</p>	<p>In English this term, the assessed pieces will be instructions and a persuasive letter. Our learning will link to our geography topic, <i>Our Country</i>. We will take part in debates about why people should visit the UK. We will use <i>The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch</i> as a stimulus for writing instructions, and <i>Coming to England</i> to help us create a persuasive poster about why someone should live in the UK.</p> <p>How you can help at home, practise giving and following simple instructions (e.g. recipes or games). Talk about reasons for visiting or living in the UK. Encourage your child to share their opinions and explain their ideas.</p>	<p>In science, we will be exploring animals including humans, with the main focus this half term on the human body and important body parts. They will be able to identify and name body parts, including the 5 senses, and will be able to explain why they are important.</p> <p>At home, you could practice naming the body parts through a game of Simon Says. You could also involve the children in daily tasks that use the senses and explain why it is important to smell, touch, taste, hear and see.</p>

They will be comparing the difference and learning about Ascension day along with Pentecost.</p> <p>We will also be exploring the topic of reconciliation and learning the stories about Levi and Zacchaeus and Isaiah.</p>	<p>In art this term, the children will be exploring textiles and collages where they will be weaving with materials such as ribbon, paper and thick thread. The children will also be looking at printing using different materials to make flags within the UK (linking to our geography topic).</p>	<p>Our topic question in geography this term is 'Our Country'. We will be looking at the 7 continents, countries in the UK and their features and we live in England. The children will also be exploring and comparing what life is like in London to other cities in the UK and they will also be using google maps to explore where they live.</p>

<p>The children will continue to explore their voices and percussion instruments. We will begin, using tuned percussion, learning about the musical alphabet from A-G. Children will begin to create their own rhythms and melodies, performing them to the class.</p>	<p>This term, children will be focusing on athletics to prepare for sports day. Children will practise running, jumping, hopping, and skipping across different spaces.</p>	<p>In computing, children will develop digital and creative skills by making their own artwork on iPads. They will use simple drawing tools and take inspiration from artists like Henri Matisse, Pablo Picasso and Piet Mondrian. Using iPads, Children will learn to use basic digital drawing tools while developing an appreciation through technology.</p>

Children will hear the story of The Good Samaritan and will be introduced to the concept of the Trinity-God as three in one community of love- and think about what the Trinity means for them. This is a simple teaching that we will return to in more complexity in later years. These stories show children that God made us to be in loving relationships with one another</p>
