



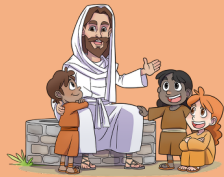

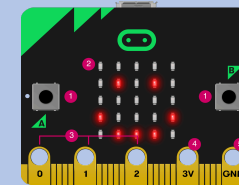

Computing

The children will continue learning how to play the recorder. They will learn how to hold and play with precision and correct technique. We will be learning how to read music of the staff. The children will learn to play as an ensemble as well as perform individually and in small groups.

In the Year 3 "Athletics" unit, pupils develop their running, jumping, and throwing skills through fun challenges and friendly competitions. They work on improving their own performance and try activities like relays and measuring how far they can jump or throw. Pupils are encouraged to support each other and celebrate their progress.

Children will continue with Chelsea Computing's coding program and be introduced to the **BBC micro:bit**, a tiny computer. They'll learn to write simple programs that control lights, buttons, and sensors, building their confidence in using real computing devices for creative projects.

First Aid

In this session, pupils will learn the importance of First Aid, quick reactions, and staying calm during an emergency. These skills can make the difference between life and death in a crisis. Children will also learn that they don't need to feel afraid during emergencies. They'll be reminded that God holds us up and gives us strength when we need it most.

Rights and Responsibilities This session will help pupils identify legal rights and understand why they matter. Pupils will reflect on how their own responsibilities connect to the rights of others. This encourages a sense of fairness, respect, and accountability. The session will celebrate diversity, recognising that everyone has value. Pupils will be reminded that we all play an important part in the Body of Christ, working together in love and unity.
