Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity. <p><i>At home: Counting to 10, sing number songs, practise writing numbers using chalk, pens etc, water play for capacity.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learning tricky words Write most letters of the alphabet Writing post cards Key texts: Handa’s Surprise, Giraffe’s Can’t Dance, I am too absolutely small for school. <p><i>At home: Practise writing their name at home and see which letters they find challenging to form; practise writing letters from the alphabet; ask questions and engage in conversations relating to text.</i></p> <p><i>You can find our key texts on YouTube.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Refine our pencil control and letter formation. Use scissors more confidently. Chopping fruit for salad. Take part in group activities & teams – Sports Day. Encouraging children to be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips. <p><i>At home: Encourage your child to be increasingly independent, use scissors to cut and make snips of paper, make a fruit salad at home,</i></p>
