













Maths	English	Science
<p>This term, we will be developing our understanding of decimals and negative numbers, building on place value knowledge and preparing the pupils for future learning in Year 6.</p> <p>At home: Spot decimals in everyday life, such as prices, measurements and distance.</p>	<p>This term, we will be studying <i>The Song from Somewhere Else</i> by A.F. Harrold. Through this thought-provoking text, children will explore themes of friendship, courage, bullying, belonging while developing a range of reading and writing skills.</p> <p>At home: Read regularly with your child and discuss what is happening in the story.</p>	<p>We will be looking at Animals, including humans. We will explore the gestation period of different mammals, the hand span of differently aged children and the changes that occur during puberty.</p> <p>At home: Encourage conversation with your child about ways they can look after their body and keep healthy.</p>

RE	Art	History
<p>This term, Year 5 will be learning about Stewardship, exploring the Christian belief that God created the world and entrusted humans to care for it. They will also learn about Islam, including the beliefs and practices of Muslims.</p> <p>At Home: Read the Creation story in Genesis and discuss ways to care for the world. Encourage respectful conversations about different faiths and beliefs</p>	<p>This half term, Year 5 will be developing their drawing and sculpture skills through a project inspired by Battersea Power Station. Children will study the famous landmark, create detailed pencil sketches and design their own 3D version of the building.</p> <p>At home: Visit local art galleries and look at portraits and sculpture. Talk about shapes in everyday life – how objects are formed or constructed.</p>	<p>This half term we will look at the Kingdom of Benin. We will learn where and when the Kingdom of Benin was in place as well as key information about the Kingdom of Benin from AD 900 - AD 1300</p> <p>At home: Visit local museums that have exhibits on the Benin Kingdom. You can also visit your local library to see what information on the Benin Kingdom your child can read on and share with class.</p>

<p>This half term, Year 5 will continue developing their drumming skills on the djembe, improving their sense of rhythm, timing, coordination and musical expression. At Home: Encourage your child to practise simple rhythms using household objects. Listen to percussion and African drumming music together and explore different rhythmic patterns.</p>	<p>This term, Year 5 will be studying cricket. In cricket, children will learn a range of skills and collaborate with a team to choose. At home: Practice basic skills: Set up a simple space at home, garden or park to practice handball throws or cricket batting. Even basic throwing and catching skills help build confidence.</p>	<p>This term, Year 5 will create their own podcasts about the Benin Kingdom, learning how to record, edit and share audio content. This will develop their communication, digital literacy and storytelling skills. At Home: Discuss online safety and responsible use of technology. Listen to age-appropriate podcasts together and talk about how information is presented to the audience.</p>
